In Spring of 1972 Honeywell Project moved its offices from 6th and Cedar (529 Cedar Avenue South), Minneapolis to a small church on Franklin - 2421 East Franklin, Minneapolis.

Sometime in 1973 (I think - I can't remember the dates) at least on two occasions within a few months of each other the offices were broken into at 2421 E. Franklin. Mimeograph machines were broken and national membership files of the New American Movement were taken.

Honeywell Project was one of two Twin City chapters of the New American Movement and Marv Davidov and Paula Giese were elected representatives of the National Interim Committee of New American Movement. The national office of N.A.M. was at 2421 Franklin from the Winter of 1971 until 1974. The National Office of N.A.M. and Chapter office of the Minneapolis chapter of N.A.M. were on the first floor of this empty church which N.A.M. rented. Honeywell Project offices were in the basement from Spring 1972 until Winter of 1974 or early 1975.

On one of the occasions when the offices were broken into and burglarized, Honeywell Project lost an important scrap book with important documents in it. Honeywell Project's files appeared to have been scrutinized and were in disarray. N.A.M. offices on the first floor were also broken into.
