NOTE: Request received 12/19/69 from White House. Presidential appointment involved, position not indicated. Dahlberg, aged 52, is a businessman from Minnesota and has been active in affairs of the Republican Party in that area for a number of years. Since 1946 he has been head of a hearing aid firm in Minnesota. In 1953 Dahlberg was involved in a serious automobile accident wherein four teen-age boys were killed. He was charged with careless driving. A grand jury hearing was subsequently held and a no bill was returned. Two police officers who were first on scene of accident and who were not called as witnesses stated they feel Dahlberg was under the influence of alcohol at time of accident. Other persons interviewed have no question regarding Dahlberg's character, reputation, loyalty, habits, or sobriety. He has had several speeding charges.
