DAHLBERG related he traveled from Minneapolis to the Miami area returning on April 7, 1972 for the purpose of obtaining the \$25,000 contribution from ANDREAS. DAHLBERG did not relate, nor was he asked by DARDIS, by what airline he traveled to the Miami area.

DAHLBERG told DARDIS that upon DAHLBERG's arrival in the Miami area, April 7, 1972, the safe deposit box of ANDREAS was closed for the night.

DAHLBERG related he talked to ANDREAS in the Miami area on April 8, 1972 and arranged a golf match with ANDREAS for the following day, April 9, 1972. They arranged to meet at the Sea View Hotel. Accordingly, DAHLBERG and his wife went to the Sea View Hotel on April 9, 1972. DAHLBERG and his wife and ANDREAS all got into the car of ANDREAS in front of the Sea View Hotel. Shortly thereafter, ANDREAS entered the Sea View Hotel alone, and soon thereafter returned to the car carrying \$25,000 cash. ANDREAS told DAHLBERG, in the presence of Mrs. DAHLBERG, that he (ANDREAS) obtained this cash from his safe deposit box at the Sea View Hotel. This incident occurred during daytime hours of April 9, 1972.

Thereafter, the DAHLBERGS and ANDREAS drove together to the Indian Creek Country Club Golf Course in Dade County, Florida. At that location, ANDREAS gave the \$25,000 cash to DAHLBERG.

DAHLBERG took the cash with him on the night of April 9, 1972 to his home in Boca Raton, Florida, where he kept the cash overnight.

On April 10, 1972, DAHLBERG took the \$25,000 cash to the First Bank and Trust Company, Boca Raton, Florida. At that location, he purchased with the cash a \$25,000 cashier's check payable to KENNETH DAHLBERG.

On April 11, 1972, DAHLBERG flew to Washington, D.C., to attend a meeting of the Republican Finance Committee at which meeting representatives of the various states had financial representatives. The meeting was held at the Washington Hilton Hotel. At this meeting DAHLBERG endorsed the \$25,000 cashier's check and handed it to MAURICE STANS, Committee Chairman. DAHLBERG stated he knows nothing of what happened to the check after he gave it to Mr. STANS.

Relative to BERNARD BARKER, DAHLBERG stated he does not know and never met BARKER. DAHLBERG was not asked by DARDIS whether or not he knew any of the other persons who were arrested with BARKER at the Democratic National Headquarters in Washington, D.C., since DARDIS stated his office has no apparent investigative interest over any of the individuals involved in the break-in of Democratic National Headquarters, excepting BARKER.

DARDIS stated that on August 24, 1972 at Dade County, Florida, he interviewed and took a signed statement from MAURICE STANS. Present during that interview were JOHN O'BRIEN and KENNETH PARKINSON of the Republican Finance Committee and prominent Miami attorneys WILLIAM FREYTES and ROBERT FLOYD. Also present was a court reporter employed by Dade County, Florida. E.L.A.

In his statement to DARDIS, MAURICE STANS confirmed what DAHLBERG had told DARDIS on August 23, 1972, about DAHLBERG giving personally to STANS a cashier's check payable to DAHLBERG, in the amount of \$25,000, at the Washington Hilton Hotel, Washington, D.C., on April 11, 1972.

DARDIS exhibited to MAURICE STANS a copy of the cashier's check payable to DAHLBERG. Thereupon STANS stated he recalled DAHLBERG had told STANS on April 11, 1972 that DAHLBERG had endorsed this check. However, STANS stated he does not recall actually having seen DAHLBERG's endorsement at the time he received the check from DAHLBERG.

MAURICE STANS also denied in his statement of August 24, 1972 knowing BERNARD BARKER. STANS was not asked
