MARTIN F. DARDIS, Chief Investigator of the Florida State's Attorney's Office for Dade County, Florida, was interviewed in the offices of his superior, RICHARD E. GERSTEIN, Florida State's Attorney. Mr. GERSTEIN was present for the initial and closing minutes of the interview, but was out of the room during the bulk of the time consumed by the interview.

MARTIN F. DARDIS furnished the following information:

On August 23, 1972, Mr. DARDIS took a sworn statement, within the confines of the Florida State's Attorney's Office for Dade County, from ~~KENNETH DAHLBERG~~, Minneapolis, Minnesota, and Boca Raton, Florida. The only other person present was a court reporter of the State's Attorney's Office.

DAHLBERG at first was reluctant to identify the source of the \$25,000 cash furnished to him as a contribution to the Republican Party's Committee to Re-Elect President RICHARD M. NIXON. Finally, however, DAHLBERG identified the source of the money as DWAYNE ANDREAS of the Minneapolis, Minnesota, area, and the Sea View Hotel, Bal Harbour, Florida. DAHLBERG stated that he received a telephone call at Minneapolis, Minnesota, on April 5, 1972. The call was originated by DWAYNE ANDREAS from the Miami area. ANDREAS and DAHLBERG discussed a prospective contribution by ANDREAS to the Republican Party. Both men had had previous discussions regarding a potential contribution by ANDREAS. At the time of the call, ANDREAS told DAHLBERG that ANDREAS then had \$25,000 cash available for a political contribution to the Republican Party. ANDREAS told DAHLBERG that ANDREAS had placed cash in a safe deposit box of the Sea View Hotel, Bal Harbour, Florida.
