Minnesota Senators

The following investigation was conducted by SA RICHARD T. TAYLOR, JR. on December 23, 1969:

*oh* [redacted] advised he has known the appointee for more than ten years as a close personal friend and professional associate in Minnesota. He has been in his company on numerous occasions during civic and political functions there. He described him as an active participant in political activities of his party and has a renowned citizen of Minnesota. His civic and public reputation is outstanding. He knows of no unfavorable information concerning his character, associates, reputation, or loyalty. He recommended him to a position of trust and responsibility in the United States Government. *I*

*oh* [redacted] to Senator EUGENE J. MC CARTHY, advised the Senator is not presently available for interview. He said he is authorized to furnish the following information in his absence: *oh*

Senator MC CARTHY has known the appointee primarily as a result of his good professional and public reputation in the State of Minnesota. He has been in his company on numerous occasions during civic and public functions in the State of Minnesota. He does consider him to be a close personal friend. He knows of no information which would cause him to question the appointee's character, associates, reputation, or loyalty. He will interpose no objections to the appointee's recommendation to a high Federal Post. *I*

Congressman MACGREGOR advised the appointee is assisting him in his campaign for nomination by his political party as a candidate for U.S. Senator from Minnesota. He said he has no question as to the appointee's character, reputation, loyalty, or associates and he highly recommended the appointee to a position of trust with the Government.
